



organise home concerts, use fake instruments

Cook with your children, it can be really creative and fun especially when improvising what to add in the pot.

Play simple games like 'The floor is lava', where pillows are the escape islands from the lava.

Play music together (it could be with anything actually, even spoons and casseroles)

Create your own treasure hunt with turfhunt

Do the crazy dance: put on some music and dance with no specific dance moves, just express yourselves

Make short walks together (stimuli generation) and decide upon different things together. Discussion and co-decision are very empowering

Build small things at home like a shelf - small craftwork is a good idea.

Unlock your child: Go back home and open a discussion initiated by you. Start by saying, 'Today I'm happy because...'. Let your child share their day with you afterwards.

Create a flower book with explanations underneath- allow children to look up the info required

Use google maps to map your environment and make it better: where are the trash cans, bus stops, walk to school etc.

Crafts with things from the nature (rocks, leaves, soil, flowers etc)- they could also paint them or make something out of them and expose them to the public

Speak emotions: How can I creatively [deal with] my emotions as well? Leave room for expression of feelings don't channel them

"... continuing stories from books you have read together."

A creative writing activity can turn into a discussion on an issue like with the stone stimulus.

Use storytelling to connect emotionally with your child and create imaginative opportunities for Oracy.

Creative writing with your child, with any stimuli possible (apart from rocks that are proposed here)

When you feel uncreative, let your child guide you to creativity; let go!

Use cards with pictures and the others have to guess what image it is. Or a variation is to build a story behind that image

Make a slideshow /art book out of it

Use your phone to take pictures outside of sth yellow, red, green, blue, black or sth Soft, rough, dry, wet, cold, hot, beautiful, ugly, new, old (explore)

Let them paint/ draw on / graffiti bedroom walls their way. Parents' decorating choice is not your children's choice

A game to play is: in my suitcase I carry... where we have to say different objects. It could be useful when children start to know letters, alphabet etc

Remember how you were, when you were their age. Remember the concerns, fears, thoughts to relate to your children

Joint sport activities such as mountain biking, recording with a GoPro camera and cutting and editing the videos together.
