

Teachers 4.0 Digital Age at EU School 2026: A Focus on Digital Innovation in Education

The European project [Teachers 4.0 Digital Age](#) will be among the protagonists of the new edition of [EU School 2026](#), an event dedicated to exploring the challenges and opportunities facing European education. The event will take place on **20 and 21 October 2026 at Officine Bellotti in Palermo.**



This year's edition, entitled *"Digital Innovation, Multiculturalism and Inclusion: New Perspectives for the School of Tomorrow"*, will bring together teachers, researchers, institutions and education professionals to reflect on the transformations shaping the future of education. The first day, **20 October**, will host the final event of **Teachers 4.0 Digital Age**, providing an opportunity to share experiences, results and perspectives developed throughout the **European project dedicated to strengthening teachers' digital competences and media literacy.**

The programme will begin at 3:00 p.m. with participant registration, followed by institutional greetings and an introduction to the key themes that will guide the two-day EU School programme.

The afternoon will feature the talk **"Educating for Critical Thinking: The Teachers 4.0 Project between Disinformation and Inclusion"**, focusing on the tools developed to equip teachers with effective competences and teaching methodologies, enabling media and digital literacy to become a driver of inclusion and contribute to building informed citizenship and a more equitable school environment.

The session will be led by **Gianna Cappello**, university lecturer and researcher specialising in media education and digital citizenship.

The day will continue with a series of workshops dedicated to European projects promoting innovation and inclusion in education. Participants will be able to choose between the workshop of the [TINKER](#) project, focused on rethinking computer science education in schools, and the workshop of the [EVECSA](#) project, which explores agriculture as an educational context for learning STEM subjects in primary schools. An information corner dedicated to the

[FreeMobi](#) project will also be available, offering materials, resources and opportunities for further exploration.

The event represents an important opportunity for dialogue between education, research and European project development, highlighting experiences that contribute to building more innovative and inclusive educational models capable of responding to the challenges of digital transformation.

The initiative is aimed at teachers, school leaders, education and training professionals, university students, researchers and anyone interested in educational innovation and media literacy.
